As we reflect on the past year, we couldn't be more grateful to our sponsors and partners, and proud of our team for the collective effort over the last 12 months to ensure that school and youth basketball at the grassroots stays alive.



Youth Development is a critical component of the YBG organization.

In spite of the challenges and inadequate access to facilities, lack of institutional support, shortfall in funding, and overall inequity in the development of the game of basketball at the grassroots; YBG nevertheless had the most extraordinary year – from hosting our inaugural Student-Athlete Conference, the first Tertiary Basketball League, and later knockout tournaments for technical institutes and university teams, the return of the National School Basketball Festival for the fifteenth year, after two years absent due to the pandemic, hosting of Regional Series and Skills Competitions, recruitment and development of new referees and officials, support for teachers and coaching development, we organized summer camp for over 100 campers, support camps in Linden and Berbice, improve school and community courts, and continue to maintain a year-round basketball academy for developing and elite players.

Once again, Youth Basketball Guyana has distinguished itself as the main server for young ballers ages 4 to 21.

We are serious about creating a sustainable and progressive platform for school and grassroots basketball, particularly for aspiring student-athletes.

The past year has really tested our resolve and stretched our team, it hasn't been easy to sustain such a high level of output for so long, but we are committed, and we give it our best effort.

For us, it is not just about basketball or sports but the opportunity to change lives and make a difference in an area that is often times neglected, so we believe that the work we do makes a difference beyond the basketball court and are thankful to all those who are helping us to make this possible.
